What does it mean to be “Arab”? Common misunderstandings and things to think about...

“The Arab world is often defined by membership in the Arab League, which consists of 22 countries...While many in the U.S. use the terms Middle East or Middle Eastern casually, it is not fully interchangeable with the more specific term Arab...The Middle East includes countries that are not considered Arab, including Iran, Turkey and Cyprus...In addition, African Arab countries are often not placed in the Middle East...”, such as Sudan and Mauritania (Arab Americans: History, Culture & Contributions, Arab American National Museum, p 11)

“...Arabs represent only one-fifth of the world’s 1.5 billion Muslims. Arabs are a minority of Muslim Americans as well. A 2011 Pew Research Center survey found that 26% of Muslim Americans and 41% of foreign-born Muslims were from the Middle East and North Africa. This highlights that Muslims are not always Arab, but in addition Arabs are not always Muslim. There are large Christian communities in many Arab countries...Historically, Arab countries have also had Jewish communities...” (Arab Americans: History, Culture & Contributions, Arab American National Museum, p 12). Additionally, many minority communities from Arab-majority countries have a complicated relationship with “Arab” identity and may or may not identify as Arab, including Coptic Christians, Kurds, Mizrahi Jews, Amazigh (Berber), etc.

Demographics | Census Counts

Today, it is estimated that nearly 3.7 million Americans trace their roots to an Arab country. Arab Americans are found in every state, but more than two thirds of them live in just ten states: California, Michigan, New York, Florida, Texas, New Jersey, Illinois, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. Metropolitan Los Angeles, Detroit, and New York are home to one-third of the population. The majority of Arab Americans are native-born. Nearly 82% of Arabs in the U.S. are citizens, 63% are Christian, and 24% are Muslim. While the community traces its roots to every Arab country, the majority of Arab Americans have ancestral ties to Lebanon, Syria, Palestine, Egypt and Iraq.

In 2017, there were an estimated 7,500 Arab Americans in Pima County and 60,000 in Arizona. [Arizona — Yalla Count Me In!](#)
