Cultural Competency and Implicit Bias Training May 18, 9 am - 4 pm

You are invited to attend our Conference training titled

"Cultural Competency and Implicit Bias." This interesting training leads us to explore questions like: How does my past affect my current beliefs? What assumptions do I make about others based on where and how I was raised? Or by the experiences that I've had? What do I really know about other cultures?

The word bias simply means an evaluation of a belief that is favorable or unfavorable. Bias in and of itself is a neutral term. If our perspective is correct and we can see things the way they are, there is no issue. However, there is an inherent bias in our perspective that keeps us from seeing people and the world the way it is.

Our faith teaches and encourages us that we do not need to be stuck in our biases. By the grace of Jesus Christ, we can overcome our biases and see people and the world as they are. The Holy Spirit enables us to see what God sees in people, especially those who are different from us.

This training is being offered throughout the Conference, with the expectation that top church leaders will participate. Your pastors have completed parts of it and will be in attendance to complete the process. Our Covenant Council scheduled this training over a year ago, but a scheduling snafu tripped us up. It's now rescheduled for Saturday, May 18, from 9 am-4 pm. Originally it was 2 trainings, but we are fortunate that it is now combined into one.

Celebrating Asian American/Pacific Islander History Month

The Rev. Samuel Om was born and raised in Cambodia and grew up Buddhist. As a young man he was a soldier in Cambodia's Civil War and was sentenced to a slow death in a Cambodian work camp run by Pol Pot's Khmer Rouge Rebels. Remarkably, he survived that ordeal. In late 1978, when Vietnam invaded Cambodia, Sam, his mother, and his sisters went to a refugee camp in Thailand. While there Sam's sister visited a Christian church and brought back a Bible, translated into the Khmer language. "One passage in the Gospel of John changed him. 'God so loved the world that he sent his only Son. . .' This God loved me, Sam thought. He loved not just humanity, but me. At a Baptist service months later in the Philippines, Sam stepped forward to accept Christ." ("Tough Test Became His Testimony," The Charlotte Observer, April 4, 2010) After he immigrated to the United States in 1981, an inner voice began to whisper to him, 'I have brought you here for a reason. Tell your people how much I have done for you.' Previously ordained in the Cambodian Evangelical Church, Sam transferred his credentials to the Western North Carolina Conference of the UMC in 2004. He served on the Committee on Asian American Ministries from 2005-12, serving as Chair from 2008-2012. Rev Om retired in 2020 after serving as a missionary to Cambodia from 2014-2017 and as the UMC's General Board of Global Ministries Director of Resource Development in Cambodia.
