




June is LGBTQ Pride Month!

Pride Month is an opportunity for the LGBTQ community and their allies to show that love, openness, honesty, and solidarity are the most powerful weapons we have against fear, hatred, and oppression. It's a chance for us all to listen to the stories, the hopes, the sorrows, and the joys of our LGBTQ family members, friends, and neighbors. St. Mark's UMC and our Church and Society Committee stand in solidarity with our LGBTQ siblings here at St. Mark's and in our greater community!



Every year around the world, LGBTQ communities celebrate Pride Month with parades and festivals. The month of June was chosen nationally to commemorate the anniversary of the Stonewall Riots of 1969, a seminal event in the LGBTQ rights movement. Tucson Pride is in the fall every year due to the heat, this year's Festival is 9/28.

When it comes to LGBTQ Pride, the word "pride" is used as an antonym for "shame." Pride Month is an opportunity for the LGBTQ community to stand up in the face of the shame that is directed their way and show that they have pride in who they are. Things have changed greatly in the last fifty years, but there are still many places around the world where it is illegal to openly be LGBTQ and people can be imprisoned or executed by their governments. Even in the United States, where marriage equality has existed nationwide since 2015, LGBTQ people still face many legal and social challenges. Many new laws have been passed across the country as part of a political backlash against expanding LGBTQ rights, targeting transgender youth and their families, LGBTQ educators or those in schools who support LGBTQ rights, and beyond. More personally, many LGBTQ people face rejection, persecution, and discrimination at home, from their families, churches, schools, and communities, and may not feel safe to openly live their true lives.

Member Spotlight: Janet Genera

My name is Janet Genera and I joined the church last spring. After meeting with Pastor Lynn recently she suggested I write my recent awakening experience. I had been a practicing Catholic for many years but could not find what I was looking for in the church.

For the last several years I had been searching for a church that I could call home. Catholic, Episcopal, Lutheran, Presbyterian and several non-denominational churches which seem to have the loudest bands... The Methodist Church was just not on my radar.

One weekend I went to St. Mark's with a friend to see another friend who was playing in a concert. I had no idea flutes can be floor standing and very large. But it wasn't the music that moved me.

As we walked into the church, I felt a presence wash over me. I felt I had come home. I returned to 8:30 service the next day. As people started coming in some of them did not recognize me. They came over, introduced themselves, welcomed me and shared information. After the service I was given more information. I wondered why I hadn't tried the church before. I don't think I ever knew a Methodist or was aware of their churches. I didn't find the church, the church found me.

The next Sunday I sat in the seat against the back wall. And for some reason that's where I sat until recently, I walked down the aisle a few rows and sat down there.

As Pastor began her Homily on the life of Jesus I realized where I was sitting, but my arms were crossed. Was I being defiant? Nope, I was cold, I am always cold. The sermon was similar to the book I wrote about Jesus, his life and actions.

I realized sitting there that the church I found was very big on fellowship and that was one of my needs, but in my own way I was not taking advantage of the fellowship. I had attended Soul Station, but did not join the meal (allergies). I came just for the teaching. So, I will start bringing my meals from home and join the community. It was miraculous. All because I sat in a row instead of the chair at the back of the church.

You might find me still, sitting near the back of worship, but not in the very back, and not with my arms crossed!

Introducing: Jeb!

You may start to notice another puppy coming to church. This puppy, Jeb, is a Service Dog in Training. On the other end of that puppy's leash is either Sandy or Matt Barker. We have been volunteer puppy raisers with Canine Companions for 19 years and have raised 13 dogs. Jeb is number 14.

Canine Companions is a national organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing highly trained service dogs at no charge to the recipient. Since 1975, they have provided over 7,300 service dogs to people with disabilities.

A Canine Companion's specialized training starts in a volunteer puppy raiser's home. The puppy raiser is responsible for the young dog's care, socialization, and the teaching of basic commands. At about one-and-a-half years of age, the future Canine Companion is returned to a CC regional training center for advanced training by a professional CC instructor. The dog is then ready for Team Training, an intensive class where candidates learn to work with a dog that is already fully trained. If you would like any more information on this organization, please visit www.Canine.org.

Jeb will be with us for about 15 months, and could be with Matt or Sandy. He will be wearing a yellow cape and what is called a gentle leader, which goes over his nose (this is not a muzzle, but like a halter for a horse). We know he is awfully cute, but please understand that as a future service dog, there are some rules for interacting with him. Please do not touch or pet him without asking. As he may be a service dog, he needs to learn that attention will not always be focused on him, and therefore, we will have "no pet" days when he is out in public. If he is asleep, please leave him alone, and do not touch or disturb him. Do not feed him any treats or food, he is on a strict diet, and not allowed to eat without permission. We will be sitting in the newly designated "Service Dog" area in the sanctuary, over by the door the choir goes in and out of.

We ask that you talk with your children and church guests about Jeb, and if you have any questions, please ask.



We continue to urge the congregation to move their online giving from Vanco to Breeze. Instructions can be found in the February issue of the Messenger or by contacting the church office.


