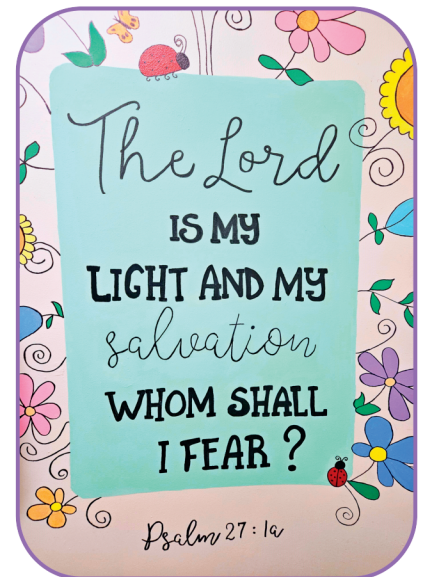

Marksmen Get Kitt Peak Treat

Joe Grisillo, a well-traveled friend of Dave Shelton, marked the beginning of the summer season for the Marksmen with a fascinating presentation on the Kitt Peak National Observatory's array of telescopes and Tucson's critical role in the astronomy world. Grisillo, who has lived and worked in the astronomy and aerospace world since his graduation from Georgia Tech in 1964, is now a docent who welcomes – and entertains – visitors to the world renowned facility.

The Kitt Peak observatories began as a "clear skies" center in the study of asteroids in 1958 and has since evolved into one of the most important sites for interstellar observation. The complex features more than 20 optical telescopes and two radio telescopes. Additionally, the observatories are now a crucial piece in the study of solar phenomena, the search for near-Earth asteroids, and calculating the probability of an impact with our planet. Rest assured, however, as Grisillo says that the next near-Earth asteroid won't happen in the near future and that the closest one that might come will be a 30,000 mile away flyby; closer to us than the moon.

If you decide to visit, pack a lunch. The Kitt Peak assemblage sits on land that is leased in perpetuity from the Tohono O'odam Nation with specific rules banning the use of the telescopes for military purposes and a ban on commercial development. Hence, no fast food is to be found on the complex.

✓ VOTE IN THE JULY 30 PRIMARY!!!

“Our involvement in political systems is rooted in the Gospel imperative to love our neighbors, to do justice, and to care for the vulnerable.” (Revised UMC Social Principals-2024)

There are two parts to the July 30 election. One is races in which there are more contenders than positions. The other is nonpartisan town elections.

There are several state congressional and local elections on the ballot. These are important. Find out which candidate most closely aligns with your values and vote for him or her. At least one office, Pima County Attorney, will be decided in the primary because only one party has candidates.

For people who are on the early ballot list, the date for ballots to be mailed out is July 3 to those registered Democrat or Republican. The last day to request a mail ballot if you are not on the automatic list is July 9. If you are a registered voter, but are not with a recognized party, you may request a Democratic or Republican ballot for this election only from Pima County Recorder's Office.. If you did not receive information about this, call the Recorder's office at (520) 724-4330.



Recommended deadline to mail back the ballot is July 23. On Election Day, July 30, one can vote in person or return your mail ballot if you still have it at any of more than 120 voting centers in Pima County. For questions, or to find a voting site, visit: <https://www.pima.gov/3199/Pima-Votes>

As part of Annual Conference 2024, our Desert SW Conference passed a resolution to “foster ways in which pronouns are encouraged.”

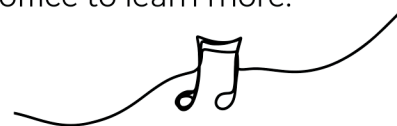
This may involve introducing yourself by saying your name, followed by “my pronouns are...”, or including your pronouns after your name on your nametag, on a video call, or in your email signature.

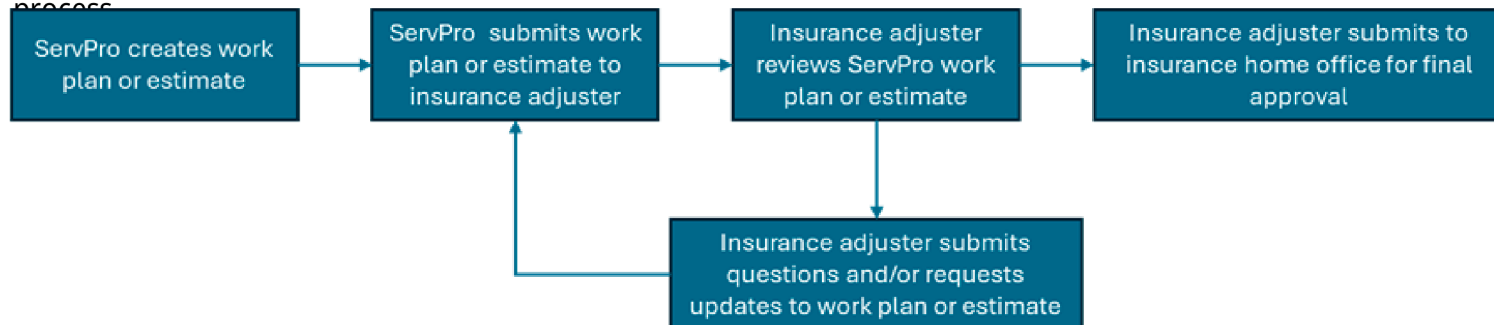

Wesley House Status

Overview:

As most you know the Wesley House was damaged by fire last August. Since then a lot has happened, albeit not apparent from the outside. We hired ServPro, a fire remediation company to handle the cleaning and repairs. The process is lengthy and requires multiple reviews, and updates before final approval. In some cases after these reviews, the insurance company has required the use of another company. Below is a simplified view of the process.



Note: Insurance adjuster has rejected estimates and directed us to other companies for inspection, mechanical engineering and architect. Process is repeated.

Accomplishments:

The youth van has been repaired. All the contents of the Wesley House have been removed, inventoried and either cleaned or disposed of. Most of the interior surfaces have been through a multi-step cleaning process. The balance of the cleaning will be done after the repairs. Most recently, the architect plans have been approved by the county and we have the permits. The fire department has also approved the plans (with edits) and provided their permit. Currently, the insurance adjuster is working with ServPro to adjudicate the original estimate (based on mechanical engineering reports on the trusses and the architect's plans).

Summary of activities since the first of the year:

- ServPro architect submitted estimate for reconstruction of the storage room, carport, house including trusses (1/25)
- St Marks submitted non-salvageable (smoke damage) items list (300 line items) and a list of items destroyed in the storage room (replacement cost, age of the item) to insurance claims office (2/5).
- Insurance adjuster rejected ServPro architect estimate, adjuster identified new, approved architect, GGV Designs (2/20).
- New Architect assessed the Wesley House on site 2/28. He submitted estimate to insurance adjuster 3/11. Insurance estimator submitted architect proposal to insurance main office for review and approval.
- Estimate from new architect was approved 4/1.
- Review by insurance of non-salvageable list and items lost in the fire completed (4/30).
- Architect sent drawings to St Marks on 5/8 for review. St Marks responded with needed updates on 5/10.
- Architectural drawings for repairs were submitted to Pima County for permits 5/14. Drawings were approved 5/28. Permit card received 6/4.
- Pima County submitted drawings to Golder Ranch Fire Department for review and approval 6/4. Received approved plans and permit 6/10.
- Servpro submitted revised reconstruction estimate sent to insurance estimator for approval 5/29. Adjuster was surprised by increase from the original estimate. Adjuster met with ServPro 6/13 at the Wesley House to review estimate. ServPro updating estimate.

Next Steps:

Once the estimate updates have been accepted and approved by the insurance company, ServPro can start the repairs.

Thank You, St. Mark's!

As your Blood Program Leader, I wish to thank our Pastors, our church staff, our church family donors, and our neighbor donors, for again, exceeding expectations with the Red Cross. We saved (up to) 81 lives! The breakdown is as follows: Red Cross had a goal to collect 18 pints of blood. We had 23 whole blood donors, and 2 Power Red donors, (Power Red counts as double). We had 3 deferrals. I am extremely impressed to share that we had a St. Mark's member who completed his 74th lifetime blood donation with us! Your cooperation is essential to being successful. From the Finance Committee

In the four months of this year, we saw a positive net income. That ended in May. Mays deficit is (\$33,123). To date we are still showing a \$82,733 surplus. Last year, at this time, we had a surplus of only \$5,809. We are in a better position than last year, but we are entering our lower-giving months, so we will continue to watch our income over the next few months.

The Finance Committee has formed two subcommittees. The first is charged with coming up with ways to encourage additional giving. The second will be charged with finding other ways that the church can obtain additional funding. Both subcommittees have met to begin their activities. Further updates on the subcommittees will report when substantial progress has been made and directions are more developed.
